Reading

As we continue with the new Accelerated Reader (AR) scheme, we continue to encourage daily home-reading of their levelled book and also for pleasure so that your child can benefit from sharing a book with you. Engaging in discussions about the characters, events, language and vocabulary will enable your child to develop a range of reading skills.

Well done to the children who are reading regularly at home and taking the AR quizzes at school. We have noticed the impact that this is having on your reading, keep up the good work.

Topic

During our Geography topic, 'What is a river?', the children will learn and use key vocabulary to describe the features of a river and the course of a river. They will explore animal and plant life and the uses of rivers as well as finding out how the River Thames has changed over time.

In Science, the children will be applying what they have learned throughout the year and exploring chemical reactions. They will learn about reversible and irreversible changes and conduct a variety of experiments such as 'Elephant's toothpaste'.

Homework

Thank you to all the children who regularly complete topic/science homework. Please remember that we would expect you to complete 2-3 pieces of topic/science homework over the term.
