COST OF LIVING SUPPORT

Medway will be issuing free school meal eVouchers again via the Edenred for the October half-term. If your child is entitled to free school meals (not the universal meals for all infant children) you will be receiving your eVouchers very soon. Remember to check your junk/spam folders if you haven't received them.

Medway Council runs a scheme called the Household Support Fund which is funded by the UK government. This scheme is to help households who are most in need of support to help with living costs. It closes on 31 March 2023 or until the budget is spent. Here is the criteria for support:

- be a Medway resident
- be aged 16 or over
- be in demonstrable hardship
- have less than £500 in your bank account
- not have access to any funds that can be relied on to meet the need you are applying for, and where you would be left with insufficient resources which would cause serious risk to your own, or your family's, health, or safety.
