HOME

Cold weather:

As the weather gets colder children are encouraged to bring in hats, gloves and scarves. Please ensure these are clearly named so they do not get lost. Children will be encouraged to keep them in their locker.

E-safety

This term we will be focussing on esafety especially when using phones or tablets to send and receive photos. We will be ensuring the children realise that once they send a photo or a message it cannot be undone.

They will also be made aware that not everyone is telling the truth in their online profiles, so they should not share details or accept anyone to be their friend unless their parents are aware.

Reading:

We ask that children bring their reading books into school on a daily basis with the reading record book signed and dated to show that your child has read to or with an adult at home every evening (if possible). The books will be changed on a Monday. It is beneficial for your children to enjoy the book with you and to engage in discussions about the characters and content of the book etc. Therefore, it is not a necessity that your child completes a whole book per night, but a few pages with lots of discussion. We have included some question prompts for you to use. This term we are focussing on retrieval and summarising the text in our daily reading sessions.

PE:

This term we will be enjoying lessons incorporating Football and Dodgeball. PE lessons are scheduled for Monday and Thursday for both classes. Monday will be outdoors with a specialised football coach. weather permitting, and Thursday will be Dodgeball indoors.

Please remember that all children are expected to take part in PE lessons and should wear the appropriate kit into school, on these days. This includes white t-shirt, either dark shorts or jogging bottoms, and trainers. Please include a jumper for your child to wear. Please remember to tie long hair back and earrings should be removed at home if they cannot do so themselves.
