

## TERM 1

## **English**

We have started our English work this term by looking at the book 'In our hands' which is the stimulus for our whole school transition work this year.



This is a beautifully illustrated picture book with a message of hope, unity and positivity that is so relevant and important for the children to see right now.

A vibrant, colourful world begins to fade to grey as ` The Dulling` spreads and all over the land , people seem to give up- " the people in charge shrugged their shoulders and said nothing could be done."

But a small girl discovers " a grain of hope", plants it and growth and colour begin to flourish once again as others join her to tend to the seed.

A wonderful version of a simple yet powerful fable. The glorious colours of the story are full of joy and vibrancy, the narrative is gentle but full of resilience and we are sure it will become a book that the children cherish.

A wish ... We continue to encourage the children to use their sounds when spelling words and would appreciate you doing the same if they are writing at home please.

## Reading

This term we will be finding every opportunity to read with the children 1:1. We love this opportunity to spend time with the children helping them to apply their use of segmenting and blending words and then re-reading for fluency. We will also be using questions to help stimulate discussions with the children about their books.

This term we are focusing on retrieval, prediction and vocabulary based questions. We will also use these when we are discussing our texts in English lessons and at the end of the day when we read together.

We ask that children read at home each night where possible and that you sign the reading record. Books will be changed on a Friday to allow time for the important act of re-reading for fluency.

Example questions you may wish to try at home could include:

'Where does ... live?'

'What does the text say ... was made of?' (Retrieval)

'What do you think the word ... might mean? Why do you think that? Are there any clues in the text?' (Vocabulary)

'What will ... do now that ... has happened?' (Prediction)



History

In Terms 1 & 2 we will be exploring events beyond living memory as well as significant people and places. To begin with we will look at the Normans and consider what exactly caused such a famous battle for someone to become King of England. We will look at the Norman Conquest and consider whether the Bayeux Tapestry is a reliable source of evidence to tell us about the Battle of Hastings? We will then begin to look at Norman castles before exploring castles in more depth in Term 2.



Just a note...

 $\underline{PE}$  lessons are scheduled for **Monday** and  $\underline{Wednesday}$  for both classes.

<u>Maths:</u> This term we are starting with Place Value before moving on to some addition and subtraction. We will be encouraging children to develop their reasoning and to use resources which will support them in their learning.

<u>Science</u>: Our science topic this term is called 'Materials Monster' where we will be thinking about what makes everyday materials suitable for their uses. We will consider the properties of different materials and sort them accordingly before inventing our own material for a specific use.

We will also be doing some artwork where we use different materials for printing and explore the different patterns that we can make.
